

33rd SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME (16 November)

First Reading

Mal 3:19-20 Gospel

Lk 21:5-19

The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evil-doers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays.

Responsorial Psalm:

The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

Second Reading

2 Thess 3:7-12

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you; not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! Lift up your heads and see; your redemption is near at hand. Alleluia! When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now - the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name - and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'


The Liturgy of the Eucharist

Having been nourished through the scripture readings at the Liturgy of the Word, we turn to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. At this part of the Mass, the gifts of bread and wine are brought to the altar and we begin the Eucharistic Prayer which is one of the most ancient prayers from our tradition. We ask the Holy Spirit to transform the bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ. We also ask that, in receiving Jesus, the entire assembly will be transformed as the body of Christ. By re-enacting the eucharistic words and actions of Jesus we remember and live anew the great events of his death and resurrection.

REFLECTION

Faith has never been about comfort. It's about courage, trust, and holding steady when life gets messy. In this Gospel, Jesus reminds us that following him doesn't mean an easy road - it means a meaningful one. Every family knows something about endurance. We live it in the ups and downs of daily life: holding our households together when work is stressful, showing love when tempers are short, keeping faith alive when the world seems to pull us in every other direction. It's not easy. Yet Jesus' words speak right into that space: "Stay with it to the end. You won't be sorry; you'll be saved." Endurance for families today might look like choosing forgiveness instead of holding a grudge, sitting together for a meal when everyone's tired, or praying together even when it feels awkward or rushed. It's the quiet strength that says, we keep showing up for each other, because love is worth it. When Jesus says that "not a hair of your head will perish," he is promising that no act of faith or love goes unnoticed. God is present in the small moments - in the school run, the family dinner, the late-night worry, the kind word spoken when it's hardest to say. As parish communities, we are called to walk together through the challenges of modern life. Our endurance as families, as neighbours, as people of faith, becomes a living sign of hope to those around us. In staying faithful and loving through it all, we quietly proclaim the Gospel in ways words never could. So keep going. Keep believing. Keep loving each other through the chaos and joy of family life. God is at work in your endurance. And through that endurance, your family's story becomes part of God's story of hope. (GPBS eNews)

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

St Teresa of Calcutta declared, "There is hunger for ordinary bread, and there is hunger for love, for kindness, for thoughtfulness, and this is the great poverty that makes people suffer so much." Pope Francis consistently challenged the world to look beyond the attention grabbers, the powerful and the oligarchs and to see instead the people at the margins of society. He set a wonderful example through, amongst other things, supporting the homeless people and rough sleepers of Rome – providing showers, food and dignity even within the structures of St Peter's. At the same time, he repeatedly told us to be watchful for poverty that is not so immediately obvious: that of loneliness and psychological neglect. Prophets of doom tell us that the world as we know it is collapsing around us. Ten out of twelve news items in a recent television programme gave updates on war, crime, climate change and an earthquake. Where was the hope? Where was the good news? As people of faith, we know that God is at the centre of everything. With Jesus in our hearts, we are inspired to make a difference to those who are living in poverty of whatever cause. We are rich, truly rich. (The Living Word)

FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH: COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION, MISSION

Snippet from the Final Document: Part I - The Heart of Synodality

27. There is a close link between synaxis and synodos, between the Eucharistic assembly and the synodal assembly. In both cases, albeit in different forms, Jesus' promise to be present where two or three are gathered in His name is fulfilled (cf. Mt 18:20). Synodal assemblies are events that celebrate the union of Christ with His Church through the action of the Spirit. It is the Spirit who ensures the unity of the ecclesial body of Christ in the Eucharistic assembly as well as in the synodal assembly. The liturgy is a listening to the Word of God and a response to His covenantal initiative. Similarly, the synodal assembly is a listening to this same Word, which resounds as much in the signs of the times as in the hearts of the faithful, and also a response of the assembly that is discerning God's will in order to put it into practice. Deepening the link between liturgy and synodality will help all Christian communities, in the diversity of their cultures and traditions, to adopt celebratory styles that make visible the face of a synodal Church. To this end, we call for the establishment of a specific Study Group which would be entrusted with reflection on how to make liturgical celebrations more an expression of synodality. It could also consider the topic of preaching within liturgical celebrations as well as the development of catechetical resources on synodality from a mystagogical perspective.
