### First Reading

2 Sam 5:1-3

All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron. 'Look' they said 'we are your own flesh and blood. In days past when Saul was our king, it was you who led Israel in all their exploits; and the Lord said to you, "You are the man who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you shall be the leader of Israel." So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and King David made a pact with them at Hebron in the presence of the Lord, and they anointed David king of Israel.

### Second Reading

Col 1:12-20

We give thanks to the Father who has made it possible for you to join the saints and with them to inherit the light. Because that is what he has done: he has taken us out of the power of darkness and created a place for us in the kingdom of the Son that he loves, and in him, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins. He is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation; for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominions, Sovereignties, Powers—all things were created through him and for him. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head. As he is the Beginning, he was first to be born from the dead, so that he should be first in every way; because God

wanted all perfection to be found in him and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace by his death on the cross.

Gospel Lk 23:35-43

The people stayed before the cross watching Jesus. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. 'He saved others,' they said 'let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.' The soldiers mocked him too, and when they approached to offer him vinegar they said, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.' Above him there was an inscription: 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said, 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it: we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

#### REFLECTION

The good thief turns to Jesus with a simple request: Remember me. He doesn't offer excuses or promises, just honesty. And Jesus responds with extraordinary compassion: Today you will be with me in Paradise. It's a reminder that God meets us not when we are perfect, but exactly where we are. For families and parish communities, this moment speaks loudly. Every home and every church pew holds someone quietly asking the same thing. Children who want to feel noticed. Teenagers trying to find where they belong. Parents stretched thin, hoping their efforts are enough. Grandparents longing to stay connected. People carrying private worries or past mistakes who wonder if God still sees them. The truth of the Gospel is that God remembers us - all of us - and invites us to remember one another. Jesus doesn't judge the thief or list his failures. He simply sees him. This is our calling too. When we choose to listen with patience, forgive generously, check in on someone who's struggling, or show kindness when it costs us something, we make the compassion of Christ visible in everyday life. This passage invites us to ask: Who in my family or parish needs to feel remembered today? How can I offer hope to someone who feels overwhelmed or unseen? Even small acts - a conversation, a smile, a moment of understanding - can become powerful signs of God's mercy. Jesus' promise on the cross is meant for us too: You are not forgotten. You are deeply loved. And there is always room for new beginnings. (GPBS eNews)

### **ADVENT REFLECTION**





#### FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH: COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION, MISSION

### Snippet from the Final Document: Part I - The Heart of Synodality

43. Synodality is primarily a spiritual disposition. It permeates the daily life of the Baptised as well as every aspect of the Church's mission. A synodal spirituality flows from the action of the Holy Spirit and requires listening to the Word of God, contemplation, silence and conversion of heart. As Pope Francis stated in his opening address of the Second Session, "the Holy Spirit is a sure guide and [...] our first task is to learn how to discern his voice, since he speaks through everyone and in all things" (Address to the First General Congregation of the Second Session of the XVI General Ordinary Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, 2 October 2024). A spirituality of synodality also requires asceticism, humility, patience and a willingness to forgive and be forgiven. It welcomes with gratitude and humility the variety of gifts and tasks distributed by the Holy Spirit for the service of the one Lord (cf. 1 Cor 12:4-5). It does so without ambition, envy or desire for domination or control, cultivating the same attitude as Christ who "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave" (Phil 2:7). We recognise the fruits of a spirituality of synodality when the daily life of the Church is marked by unity and harmony in pluriformity. No one can progress along the path of authentic spirituality alone; we need support, including formation and spiritual accompaniment, both as individuals and as a community.
