

24th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME (17th September)

First Reading

Sirach 27:30-28:7

Rom 14:7-9

Resentment and anger, these are foul things, and both are found with the sinner. He who exacts vengeance will experience the vengeance of the Lord, who keeps strict account of sin. Forgive your neighbour the hurt he does you, and when you pray, your sins will be forgiven. If a man nurses anger against another, can he then demand compassion from the Lord? Showing no pity for a man like himself, can he then plead for his own sins? Mere creature of flesh, he cherishes resentment; who will forgive him his sins? Remember the last things, and stop hating, remember dissolution and death, and live by the commandments. Remember the commandments, and do not bear your neighbour ill-will; remember the covenant of the Most High, and overlook the offence.

Responsorial Psalm:

The Lord is kind and merciful; slow to anger and rich in compassion.

Second Reading

The life and death of each of us has its influence on others; if we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord, so that alive or dead we belong to the Lord. This explains why Christ both died and came to life, it was so that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.

Gospel Mt 18:21-35

Peter went up to Jesus and said, 'Lord, how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times. 'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time," he said, "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me," he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said, "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'

 In the foyer are small laminated cards (containing the Confiteor, Gloria, Apostles Creed and the Invitation to Prayer) and large Mass cards, to help you better participate in the Mass should you need these as an aid. There is also a reflection on the four Sacred Silences through the Mass. We ask that you please leave all the cards in the Church.

REFLECTION

The spirit of unforgiveness lurks in Peter's question about "how much" forgiveness is required. What he's really asking is: When can I reasonably refuse to forgive those who offend me? Surely there's a limit to how much forgiveness is strictly necessary. Jesus won't play this game. Jesus paints God as a king willing to forgive an outrageous sum owed him, not because it's necessary – a king has no obligation to forgive anything – but for compassion's sake. Peter, in the guise of the first servant, sees his anger against his brother as actually justifiable. In the world of gospel parable, that attitude is destined for destruction. Holding others bound to their sin poisons our love. Our forgiveness reveals how far short we fall of the mercy God shows to us. When I'm in opposition to a sister or brother, I know it's for my sake, as much as for theirs, that I find my way to forgiveness. To the extent that I choke my neighbour with my wrath, that's how far the embrace of sin has choked the love out of me. Whom do you find hardest to forgive? What makes it hard, and what price do you pay for unforgiveness?

In past years it has been our practice to send letters of acknowledgement to all our Planned Giving contributors. However, at our last Parish Finance Committee Meeting, Fr. Jaybee pointed out that we were overlooking the equally valuable gifts we receive by way of the loose collections. In total, for year ended 30th June 2023, that amounted to \$125,584.00. This represented approximately two thirds of our total income of \$205,863, which excluding the transactions that were related to the presbytery sale and build, produced a small surplus for the twelve months of some \$1,988.

When Fr Jaybee returns from his current Long Service Leave, we will present a more detailed account, including the final presbytery outcome. In the meantime, he was anxious that we express heartfelt appreciation for the generosity that allows our Parish to look forward to the years ahead.
