# First Reading

In the days to come the mountain of the Temple of the Lord shall tower above the mountains and be lifted higher than the hills. All the nations will stream to it, peoples without number will come to it; and they will say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the Temple of the God of Jacob that he may teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths; since the Law will go out from Zion, and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.' He will wield authority over the nations and adjudicate between many peoples; these will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles. Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war O House of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

# Second Reading

Rom 13:11-14

You know 'the time' has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left. 'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be guite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

### **REFLECTION**

As we enter the first Sunday of Advent, Matthew's reminder to stay awake speaks directly into the rhythm of family life and parish community. So often our days are filled with activity work, appointments, sport, caring for children or ageing parents, managing responsibilities and trying to keep everything moving. Like the people in Noah's time, we can get swept up in the ordinary and miss the guiet ways God is working in and around us. Advent interrupts that pattern. It invites us to slow down enough to notice, to listen, to be present to what matters most. For families this Gospel is a gentle but urgent nudge to pay attention to the sacred moments hidden inside everyday life. It might be the honesty of a child's question at the dinner table, the silent support of a spouse, a chance encounter that lifts our spirits or the pull to pray even when we feel tired. God often arrives disguised in simplicity and relationship. Advent asks us to prepare our homes, not with perfection, but with openness. It reminds us that Christ enters the world through small, ordinary doorways, and those doorways often sit right in our kitchens, our living rooms and our parish gatherings. For parish communities the call is just as strong. These weeks are a chance to rekindle hope, to reconnect with one another, to notice who might feel lonely or forgotten, to reach out beyond our comfort zones and to welcome others with generosity. Advent awakens a shared sense of responsibility for one another and invites us to walk together with hearts that are expectant, courageous and ready. As we begin this season may we resist the temptation to rush through these weeks and instead remain awake to the grace unfolding around us. May our homes be places of kindness and peace. May our parishes be communities where people feel known, supported and encouraged. May we hold space for God to surprise us. Advent is not just a countdown to Christmas it is an invitation to live with attentiveness and hope, trusting that Christ is already drawing near. (GPBS eNews)

#### PREPARING FOR CHRISTMAS



# Snippet from the Final Document: Part I - The Heart of Synodality

51. We should, therefore, look to the Gospels to outline for us the journey of conversion we are required to undertake, learning little by little to make Jesus' practices our own. The Gospels present to us a Lord who is often "in the act of listening to the people who come to Him along the roads of the Holy Land" (DCS 11). Jesus never sent anyone away without stopping to listen and to speak to them, whether men or women, Jews or pagans, doctors of the law or publicans, righteous men and women or sinners, beggars, the blind, lepers or the sick. By meeting people wherever their history and personal freedom had led them, He revealed to them the face of the Father. By listening to the needs and to the faith of those He met, and by responding through words and gestures. He renewed their lives, opening the path to healed relationships. Jesus is the Messiah who even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak" (Mk 7:37). He asks us, His disciples, to do the same and, through the grace of the Holy Spirit, gives us the capacity to do it conforming our hearts to His: only "the heart makes all authentic bonding possible, since a relationship not shaped by the heart is incapable of overcoming the fragmentation caused by individualism" (DN 17). When we listen to our sisters and brothers, we are participants in the way that God in Jesus Christ comes to meet each of us.
